

2019 Supplementary CAM Rules

- In 2019, the CAM Challenge Series of seven (7) events will crown a year-end CAM Series Champion in each class and an overall CAM Champion. Points will be earned by running CAM Series Challenge events during the year.
- To be eligible for the year-end CAM Challenge Class Championship and the over-all CAM Challenge Championship, you will be able to count your two (2) best class finishes at the first six (6) events plus the SCCA® Solo® Nationals in Lincoln, NE. Points earned at the Solo® Nationals will be awarded at 150%. You must participate at the Solo® Nationals in Lincoln, NE to be eligible for the year-end CAM Championships.
- Points will be awarded at each CAM Challenge event using the following formula. A competitor that completes at least one (1) timed run will receive a minimum of 30 points.

$$Points\ per\ event = 100 - (\left(\frac{Entrant's\ Time - Class\ Winning\ Time}{Class\ Winning\ Time}\right)x\ 900)$$

EXAMPLE: Winning time (sec.) = 43.398; 2nd place = 43.481; 3rd place = 44.120

1st place = 100 points

2nd place =
$$43.481 - 43.398 = 0.083$$
; $\left(\frac{0.083}{43.398}\right) = 0.0019$; $0.0019 \times 900 = 1.72$; $100 - 1.72 = 98$ points

$$3rd\ place = 44.120 - 43.398 = 0.722; \left(\frac{0.722}{43.398}\right) = 0.016;$$

$$0.016\ x\ 900 = 14.97; 100 - 14.97 = 85\ points$$

- The Chief Steward for the CAM Challenge Series is Raleigh Boreen; the official points keeper is Velma Boreen.
- Awarding of points:
 - ProSolo Events All CAM cars will run in one (1) indexed CAM class. At the end of class competition, each competitor will be awarded points on based on his/her actual CAM class. The top finishing driver in each of the respective CAM classes will get 100 points. Others in their respective classes will get points based on the formula in each of the respective CAM Classes. The total number of CAM entries will determine an 8- or 16-car CAM Challenge.
 - Champ Tour Events CAM competitors will run in their respective classes at the Champ Tours.
 Points will be awarded in each CAM Class. At the end of traditional competition, there will be a 9-car Challenge. Cars in the CAM Challenge will be the first three from each class.
 - Match Tour Events CAM competitors will run in their respective classes at the Match Tours.
 Points will be awarded in each CAM Class. At the end of the competition, there will be an 8- or 16-car Challenge contingent on the number of class entries.
 - Solo Nationals –CAM competitors will run in their respective classes. Points will be 150% of the formula. The top points person in each class will be awarded the year-end Championship. The top point person for the year in all three classes will be the 2019 Overall CAM Champion. If there is a tie score in any class or for the Overall Championship, the tie breaker will be based on the best times from the Solo Nationals after factoring the PAX/RTP Index.







2019 Tire Rack® SCCA® CAM Challenge Series

Event Information

• For 2019, there will be CAM Challenge Series events around the country with Challenge Champions crowned in all three CAM classes and an overall CAM Challenge Series Champion crowned in Lincoln, NE at the 2019 Tire Rack SCCA® Solo® Nationals.

• Series Structure

- Points will be awarded at the events below, with the Challenge Championship Finale (Solo® Nationals) having weighted points (50% greater than season points). Details on points to be released later.
- Drivers will score their best two (2) CAM Challenge event in class AND the Challenge Championship Finale in Lincoln.
- o Challenge Series Champions will be awarded in all classes CAMC, CAMT, and CAMS.
- The overall CAM Challenge Series Champion will receive a special award to be announced later.
- CAM classes will continue as supplemental classes at the Tire Rack® SCCA® Solo®
 National Championship event, although that event will be scored for points as part of the CAM Challenge Series.

Events

- March 21-23: <u>Southern States CAM Challenge</u> in conjunction with the Charlotte Champ Tour at zMAX Dragway in Concord, NC. Class competition will run on Friday and Saturday due to site restrictions on Sunday, with Test and Tune on Thursday.
- April 12-14: <u>Gulf States CAM Challenge</u> in conjunction with the Grenada ProSolo® at the Grenada Airport in Mississippi.
- April 26-28: <u>Northern Pacific CAM Challenge</u> in conjunction with the Crows Landing Champ Tour at the former Naval Air Station in Crows Landing, CA.
- May 31-June 2: <u>Central States CAM Challenge</u> in conjunction with the Texas ProSolo® at the Mineral Wells Airport.
- June 14-16: <u>Southern Pacific CAM Challenge</u>, run in conjunction with the San Diego Match Tour at Qualcomm Stadium in California.
- August 9-11: <u>Eastern States CAM Challenge</u> a stand-alone CAM event, at the Grissom Aeroplex in Peru, IN.
- September 3-4: <u>CAM Challenge Championship Finale</u> in conjunction with the Tire Rack® SCCA® Solo® National Championships at the Lincoln Airpark West in Nebraska. All CAM classes will run on Tuesday/Wednesday.
