

The Tire Rack SCCA National Tour is a series of 10-12 events where drivers have the opportunity to pit themselves against some of the top cars and drivers in the country. These events will prepare drivers for the ultimate test - the Tire Rack SCCA Solo National Championships held in Lincoln, Nebraska in September. Each Tour stop features two days of competition on two courses. Every driver gets three chances at both courses with their fastest Day 1 time and fastest Day 2 time being combined into a total time for scoring purposes. Each stop provides an opportunity to earn class points towards the title of Tour Class Champion.

## CLASS CHAMPIONSHIPS AND SERIES POINTS GUIDELINES

- A. Series points for the SCCA National Tour events will be accumulated by National Tour Series class finishing positioning in the best three (3) events entered. Competitors must compete in the Solo Nationals Championship event in order to be eligible for Tour year-end trophies. Series points will only be awarded to entrants with an annual membership at the time the event points are earned.
- B. Awarding of Points
  1. An event is counted for the class championship when a driver has started at least one (1) run in class competition at an event. Points are awarded on a per-class, per-event basis.
  2. In case of a point finishing position tie, the tiebreaker will be their relative finishing position in the Solo Nationals Championship.
  3. If a competitor is disqualified at the Tire Rack® SCCA® Solo® National Championship, all or a portion of the Series points may be revoked, and their finishing position may be vacated.
  4. End of the year class awards will be presented based on the following schedule of the number of Series participants. To be considered a Series participant, a driver must compete in three (3) National Tour Series events and the Tire Rack® SCCA® Solo® National Championship.

1 - 2	1
3 - 5	2
6 - 8	3
9 - 11	4
12 and over	5

- C. Class Points
  1. Points will be performance based utilizing the following formula for each event:  

$$100 - (900 \times ((\text{Entrant's Time} - \text{Class Winning Time}) / (\text{Class Winning Time})))$$
  2. Competitors who complete at least one timed run per event will receive a minimum of 20 points for that event.
  3. Class Points Example:
